

## UTR1.61 A.J. SCHULZ PRIZES AND SCHOLARSHIP IN GERMAN

- A. In 1957, the late Adolf John Schulz bequeathed £4,500 to the University to promote postgraduate research work in the theory of education, and the study of the German language, literature and culture generally

“...As to the sum of £4,500 for the University of Adelaide to be invested and accumulated as hereinafter directed and the proportion of annual income available for distribution to be devoted to the following purposes –

October 2018 the Attorney General for the State of South Australia sanctioned a proposal by the University of Adelaide that the trust be varied as follows:

“the University is authorised to offer annual awards in any or all courses in German language and/or culture leading to a Bachelor degree

## Name of the fund

1. The capital sum, all income arising from the capital sum and any accumulations and additions thereto together form a fund called the ‘AJ Schulz Prizes and Scholarship in German’ (‘fund’).

## Investment of the fund

2. The fund is to be amalgamated for the purposes of investment, and held in a common fund, and the net income earned by the common fund shall be credited, rateably, to the funds so amalgamated and thereafter distributed according to the trusts specified by the donor.

## Obligations

3. In administering the fund, the University must adhere to the terms specified and is obliged:
  - (a) to invest the capital sum according to the directions of the donor; and
  - (b) to establish prizes and a scholarship to be administered in accordance with the following Rules.

## Rules

### AJ Schulz SACE Prize for German

#### Title

1. The prize shall be known as the ‘AJ Schulz SACE Prize for German

#### Value

2. The value of the Prize shall be \$500 or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of income available from the Endowment Fund.

#### Eligibility

3. To be eligible for the prize candidates must have
  - a) completed the continuer’s stream of German at the SACE Stage II Examination year prior to the year the prize is being awarded;
  - b) accepted a place in any undergraduate program in the Faculty of Arts, Business, Law and Economics at the University of Adelaide; and
  - c) be enrolled in a course in German at the time the prize is awarded.
4. Candidates are ineligible if they:
  - have provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize;

## Selection of Candidate

15. The Prize shall be awarded annually to the candidate who achieves the highest mark for a course stated above as

34. Candidates are ineligible if they:

- have been found guilty of misconduct by the Student Misconduct Tribunal and have had relevant penalties imposed on them in accordance with the University Policies, Rules and Statutes for Student Misconduct.

#### Selection of Candidate

35. The Prize shall be awarded annually to the top Honours student in German studies who has produced the best thesis as determined by the Head of Department, European Languages and Linguistics (or nominee).

36. If the Prize is not awarded in any year, then the available income distribution shall be as follows:
