Memorial Chapel

Memorial Chapel was built in 1955 and is a fine example of a Gothic Revival style. It was designed by the architect J. H. Stanger and is a Grade II listed building. The chapel is a small, single-story building with a gabled roof and a prominent square tower with a crenellated top. The tower is decorated with Gothic Revival motifs, including a pointed arch window and a small spire. The chapel is situated in the grounds of Roseworthy Hall and is a popular place of worship for the local community.
